

**Feline population Control of The Carolinas provides reduced cost Ovariohysterectomies and Castrations .**

DONE ON AN, AS AVAILABLE BASIS, PLEASE CALL FOR AN APPOINTMENT. YOU MUST INFORM THE RECEPTIONIST THAT YOU ARE SCHEDULING A CLINIC NEUTER WHEN MAKING THE APPT. AND ON ARRIVAL.

Clinic Cat Castration (Neuter) \$ 48.00

Clinic Cat Ovariohysterectomy (Spay) \*\* \$ 85.00

\*\*Cats must be under 1 year of age. They cannot be pregnant or in heat, and cannot have recently given birth.(In heat \$20.00 extra. Pregnant-Regular fees apply)

Cats must be clean and free of fleas. (\$20.00 to \$35.00 to clean and de-flea)

Clinic Program Ovariohysterectomies and Castrations will be performed under typical low cost neuter clinic conditions, meaning:

1. Injectable anesthesia
2. No electronic monitoring
3. No intravenous catheters or fluids

**HOWEVER:** Sterile instruments and gloves will be used in all procedures!

**Please Note:** Complications are a possibility, though not a probability, with any surgical procedure. We will not be responsible for any costs associated with any complication of a Clinic Program Surgical Procedure.

The hospital will be available to you from 8:30 am until 6pm Monday through Friday and 8:30 am until 12 pm on Saturday. After these hours and on weekends concerns should be directed to Animal Emergency Clinic of Cary 220 High House Road **462-8989**. Normal fees apply to any subsequent visits.

**THE PET IMMUNIZATION PROJECT**

**Is offered only on the following Fridays:**

**July 11<sup>th</sup> 2008, October 10<sup>th</sup> 2008, January 9<sup>th</sup> 2009, April 10<sup>th</sup> 2009, July 10<sup>th</sup> 2009.**

**From 9am to 12pm (On a first come first serve basis)**

The hours listed allows Chatham and West Cary Animal Hospitals to provide a low cost alternative for achieving maximum immunization among the population of susceptible pets.

During the hours listed please tell the receptionist at the time of service that you have come for the immunization project. Cats must be in carriers and dogs must be on leashes.

Deworming medications will also be offered at a reduced price depending on:

- A) The type of intestinal parasites found-----
- B) The size and species of animal being treated

Usually Cats \$ 8-10 and Dogs \$ 10-28

\*\*\* The clinic vaccination physical exam is used to assess the animals' suitability to receive immunization. The purpose of this program is to provide a low cost alternative for healthy animals. If other problems are found that need to be addressed or prevent immunization from being done another appointment can be scheduled to address these issues.
